

Sector Membership

Some State Regulators are Individual NERC Members

Most state commissions participate through the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC).



What are Public Service Commissions?

State agencies created by state legislatures

- Regulate monopoly utilities and utility services.
- Public Utility Commissions, Public Service Commission, Utility Boards, etc.
- Can have a variety of services within their jurisdiction
 - Directly established by state legislatures
 - Indirectly established by Federal Power
 Act (FPA) and Natural Gas Act (NGA)

Commissioners and expert staff

- Commissioners are either appointed by Governors or elected
 - Appointed in most common
 - Elected in 11 states
- Staff typically consist of engineers, accountants, attorneys, and environmental scientists.

Typical State Commission Responsibilities

Ensure that utilities provide reliable, affordable, and fair services while maintaining financial stability and protecting consumers

Electricity

- Retail Electric Rates
- Siting of infrastructure
- Need for Generation and Transmission
- Distribution system standards and investment

Water

Natural Gas

Telecom

Broadband

Other Key Responsibilities

- Oversight enforce rules, monitor service quality, etc.
- Dispute Resolution
- Policy Development
- Ensure utilities operate in the public interest
- Interact with other relevant state agencies (environmental regulator, consumer advocates, etc.)



Contested Proceedings

Structured similarly to court cases

- discovery and evidence
- Testimony and cross-examinations
 Involve many stakeholders / intervening parties

- Balancing (or aligning) Public Interest and Utility Interests
- Technological Advancements
 - Challenge regulatory structures, planning assumptions, etc.
- Political and Public Pressures
 - Affordability
 - Siting of infrastructure
 - Maintaining RA
 - Supporting new economic development
